Charlie Crist, the Department of Juvenile Justice and the Department of Corrections. For 10 years at the helm of the Tallahassee Police Department, Chief McNeil was recognized for his progressive voice and his effective response to citizen concerns. In 2012, as President of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, Chief McNeil traveled to foreign countries to discuss methods to combat terrorism, human trafficking, cybercrimes and other 21st century concerns that may impact global security and policing issues. 

A Message From Our Executive Director

From my heart to yours,

My new professional journey began July 22, 2019 – my first day as Executive Director of Good News Outreach (GNO). The Board gave me the chance to experience a whole new world – a world filled with humility, excitement, and reward. I have seen first-hand how GNO serves citizens in need and the impact we have on their lives. I am profoundly grateful for the chance to learn and grow from the persons we serve. Good News has "good bones" and a rich spiritual legacy dating back to 1986, when four men were touched by God to leave their jobs to serve those in need. From its inception as a French Town Food Bank, GNO has operated with an emphasis on faith and volunteerism. Good News is non-denominational – our partners come from all faith and those who do currently profess faith. We united in our desire to serve "the Least of These".

Here is a brief ministry update for those who are not familiar with Good News:

- The Elder Services Program serves senior citizens who live at home.
- The Food Ministry provides groceries to needy citizens on a biweekly basis.
- Maryland Oaks Crossing Community allows over 100 single parents and children a safe and affordable place to live in a lovely shaded community and a wide variety of educational and social services.
- Mercy House is a Post Release Transitional Substance Abuse Program which helps men recently released from prison achieve a successful life. Services include job readiness training, money management and budgeting, social activities, and spiritual development.

We plan to increase the impact and efficiency of our programs through strategic partnerships with like-minded agencies. Ready 4 Work – Tallahassee currently offers job coaching and employment assistance and substance abuse and mental health counseling, and other services to the men of Mercy House. In the next 90-days, ECHO Outreach Ministries will start providing case management services to our clients. Partnerships allow us to increase our impact and to be better stewards of our resources.

Areas of In-Kind Support:

- Truck, Van or SUV to support Mercy House, The Food Program, & senior program
- Non-perishable food items such as: boxed pasta-cereal-milk; canned soups-vegetables-ravioli-fruits; peanut butter; jelly; juice; fruit cups. We serve 150-200 families per week. We receive 30-40% of our food from Second Harvest and Farm Share but depend on YOU for the other 60-70%
- Senior supplies: Ensure, Boost, Glucerna, adult diapers (size S, M, L, XL, XXL). We serve on average 180 seniors each week so these supplies are a wonderful addition to the food they receive.
- Painting, pressure washing, paving, mobile home skirting and light
 Maintenance and repair at Maryland Oaks Crossing and Mercy House.
